## PROJECT OVERVIEW

At Pepco, we are committed to providing safe, reliable, affordable, and sustainable energy to our customers and communities. As part of that commitment, Pepco will be upgrading energy grid infrastructure through the Takoma to Sligo Underground Line Project in downtown Silver Spring, the City of Takoma Park, and parts of Prince George's County and the District of Columbia to meet growing demand and to enhance the capacity and reliability of our system.

## STRENGTHENING SYSTEMS & PREPARING FOR GROWTH

The Takoma to Sligo Underground Line Project will create a more resilient and reliable system that includes installing new underground lines between the Takoma and Sligo substations and increasing the capacity of the Sligo substation. Pepco will also be replacing aging infrastructure that is near the end of its service life and upgrading and installing new equipment at each substation. The newly constructed infrastructure will provide increased capacity for the area and will better serve the community.

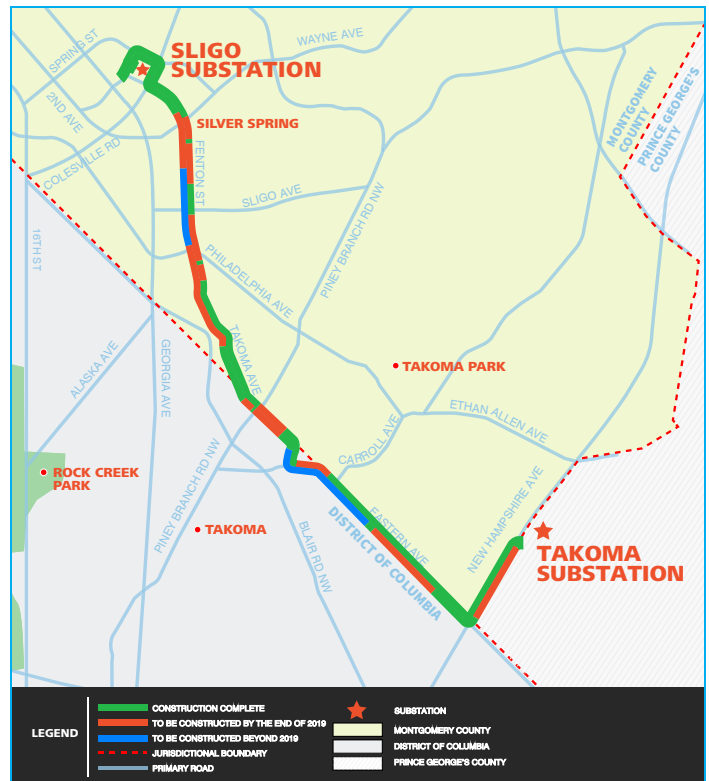
## PROJECT TIMELINE AND CONSTRUCTION

Construction for this project began in 2018 and will continue through December 2022. The work will affect traffic along several roads including Fenton Street, Eastern Avenue, and New Hampshire Avenue. Work will typically take place Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

## IMPACTS ON THE COMMUNITY

We understand that work in your neighborhood can cause disruption such as road closures, and Pepco will work to minimize impacts to residents and the community. We are coordinating with local governments and communities on our hours of operation and traffic control plans to ensure the public and workers are safe while striving to keep disruption to a minimum. Proper flagging and signage will be used to minimize delays.
